NVSO Participants Set 46 New Records

At the recent conclusion of the 2023 Northern Virginia Senior Olympics, Herb Levitan, Chair, reported 46 new records were set during the two weeks of events, Sept. 9 - 24. He said the record breaking events were in diving, swimming, ten pin bowling, six track events, four field events and the 5K trail race

Multiple gold, silver and bronze medals were awarded at nearly 70 events. "We had pretty good weather throughout until the next to last day when we had to reschedule a couple of events thanks to Tropical Storm Ophelia," said Levitan. NVSO also set a new a record with 924 men and women over the age of 50 registered, an 11% increase over 2022. More men than women registered and the greatest percentage of men were in the 75-79 age group and for women it was the 75-84 age group. The oldest participant was Eva Sorensen of Alexandria, age 100. She participated in ten pin bowling, cribbage, Mexican train dominoes and rummikub.
